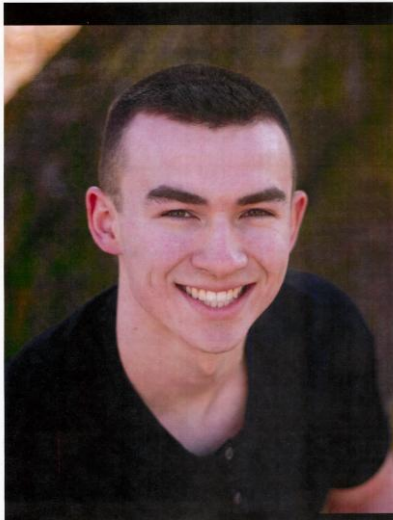
Adeline Rang
